

MORE ON FEMININE NOUNS

In feminine nouns that have an ϵ , ι , or ρ before the final α , that final α is long.

Singular	
Nominative	ἡ καρδιά means the heart . (<i>subject of sentence</i>)
Genitive	τῆς καρδίας means of the heart . (<i>shows possession</i>)
Dative	τῇ καρδίᾳ means to (or for) the heart . (<i>indirect object</i>)
Accusative	τὴν καρδίαν means the heart . (<i>direct object</i>)
Vocative	καρδιά means heart . (<i>direct address</i>)

*In ἀλήθεια and ἀλήθειαν, the last α is short instead of long. This exception occurs in only a few words.
