Singular

1st Person eram means I was.

Plural

1st Personerāmus meansWe were.2nd Personerātis meansYou (pl.) were.3rd Personerant meansThey were.

Notice the change in the imperfect tense vowel (\bar{a}) which is placed between the stem, er-, and the active ending.
